## DID YOU KNOW?

1 in 3 American adults is at high risk for Kidney Disease (KD) ••• The risk of KD increases to 1 in 2 over a the course of a lifetime ••• 1 in 9 American adults has KD – and most don't know it ••• Diabetes and high blood pressure are the two leading causes of KD ••• Nearly 26 million Americans have diabetes ••• More than 224,000 people are currently living with kidney failure caused by diabetes ••• 73 million American adults have high blood pressure, 20% don't know it ••• KD kills over 90,000 Americans every year – more than breast and prostate cancers combined ••• Because KD often has no symptoms, it can go undetected until it is very advanced ••• Early detection and treatment can slow or prevent the progression of KD ••• Of the over 120,000 Americans on the waiting list for a lifesaving organ transplant, more than 96,000 need a kidney. Fewer than 17,000 people receive one each year ••• Every day 13 people die waiting for a kidney ••• Once the kidneys fail, dialysis or a kidney transplant is required ••• Over 415,000 Americans are on dialysis and approximately 180,000 live with a functioning kidney transplant ••• Annual medical payments for a patient with KD increase from \$15,000 in stage 3 to \$28,000 in stage 4 to more than \$70,000 in stage 5 ••• The average annual number of physician visits for an individual with diagnosed KD is 10.28 – second only to cancer ••• Almost 60 billion US health care dollars are spent annually to treat people with KD
