Pitfalls of Medical Practice

Enhance competence and performance skills of the interdisciplinary team to improve care of patients needing primary and/or specialty care and facilitate productive, collegial interaction between the total medical team including physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, dentists, social workers, and first responders.

DID YOU KNOW?

1 in 3 American adults is at high risk for Kidney Disease (KD) • The risk of KD increases to 1 in 2 over a the course of a lifetime • 1 in 9 American adults has KD – and most don't know it • Diabetes and high blood pressure are the two leading causes of KD • Nearly 26 million Americans have diabetes • More than 224,000 people are currently living with kidney failure caused by diabetes • 73 million American adults have high blood pressure, 20% don't know it • KD kills over 90,000 Americans every year – more than breast and prostate cancers combined • Because KD often has no symptoms, it can go undetected until it is very advanced • Early detection and treatment can slow or prevent the progression of KD • Of the over 120,000 Americans on the waiting list for a lifesaving organ transplant, more than 96,000 need a kidney. Fewer than 17,000 people receive one each year • Every day 13 people die waiting for a kidney • Once the kidneys fail, dialysis or a kidney transplant is required • Over 415,000 Americans are on dialysis and approximately 180,000 live with a functioning kidney transplant • Annual medical payments for a patient with KD increase from \$15,000 in stage 3 to \$28,000 in stage 4 to more than \$70,000 in stage 5 • The average annual number of physician visits for an individual with diagnosed KD is 10.28 – second only to cancer • Almost 60 billion US health care dollars are spent annually to treat people with KD
