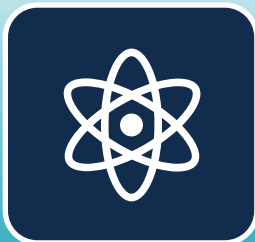

DID YOU KNOW?

1 in 3 American adults is at high risk for kidney disease (KD) • The risk of KD increases to **1 in 2** over the course of a lifetime • **1 in 7** American adults has KD, and most don't know it • **Diabetes and high blood pressure** are the two leading causes of KD • Nearly **34 million** Americans have diabetes • More than **247,000** people are currently living with kidney failure caused by diabetes • **116 million** American adults have high blood pressure, and 20% don't know it • KD kills over 100,000 Americans every year—more than breast and prostate cancers combined • Because KD often has **no symptoms**, it can go undetected until it is very advanced • **Early detection** and treatment can slow or prevent the progression of KD • Of the over **113,000** Americans on the waiting list for a lifesaving organ transplant, more than **99,800** need a kidney. Fewer than **17,000** people receive one each year • Every day, over **13 people die** waiting for a kidney • Once the kidneys fail, dialysis or a kidney transplant is **required** • Over **558,000** Americans are on dialysis and approximately **193,000** live with a functioning kidney transplant • Annual medical payments for a patient with KD increase from **\$16,000** in stage 3 to **\$30,000** in stage 4 to more than **\$72,000** in stage 5 • The average annual number of physician visits for an individual with diagnosed KD is 10.28—second only to cancer • Almost **114 billion** US health care dollars are spent annually to treat people with KD • Kidney Disease affects 37 million adults in the US and costs Medicare over \$130 billion annually
