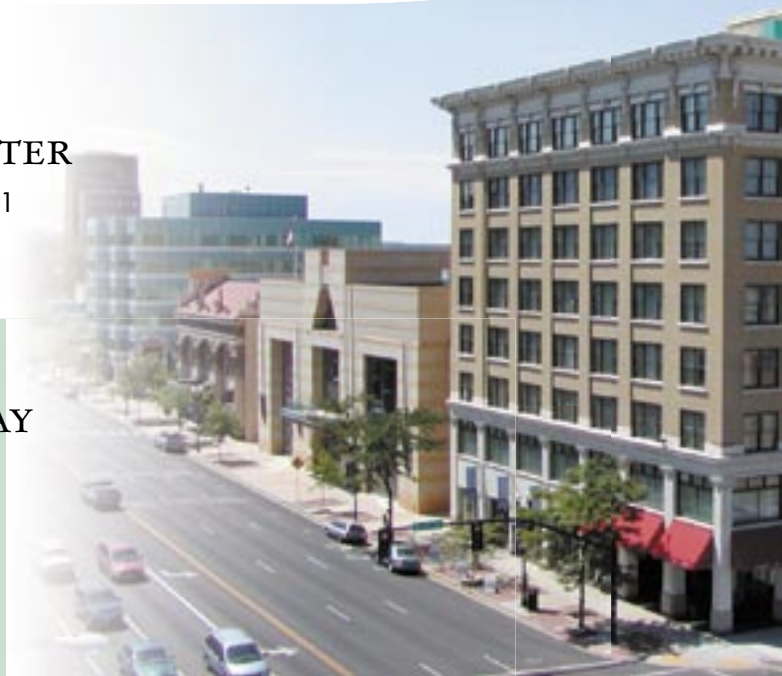

# FACULTY

## STEPHEN PRESCOTT, M.D.

A native of Texas, Prescott received his M.D. from Baylor College of Medicine. He founded the Eccles Program in Human and Molecular Biology and Genetics at the University of Utah and has served on medical and scientific committees for the NIH and AHA. He currently is serving as President of the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation.

## RICK CARLSON, JD

Mr. Carlson is President of The Health Strategies group and serves as a consultant in the health care industry. He has co-authored *The Terrible Gift: The Brave New World Of Genetics Medicine*, and is clinical professor of policy programs at the University of Washington in Seattle.

## RICHARD WAHL, M.D.

Dr. Wahl is Professor of Radiology and Oncology; Director of the Division of Nuclear Medicine and Associate Director (clinical research) of the ICMIC. He joined the faculty of Johns Hopkins University in 2000 and holds the Henry N. Wagner Professorship in Nuclear Medicine.

## STEVEN J. LEEDER, PHARM.D., PH.D.

Dr. Leeder is on the faculty at the University of Kansas, is the section chief of Developmental Pharmacology and Experimental Therapeutics, is a professor of pediatrics and pharmacology and holds the Marion Merrill Dow Endowed chair in Pediatric Pharmacogenomics.

## LARRY SCHUT, M.D.

Dr. Schut is a world renowned neurologist and researcher who has made ataxia his life work. He serves as the medical director of The National Ataxia Foundation and is also on the NAF Medical and Research Advisory Board. For generations, his family has suffered from ataxia, and he knows first hand the devastation of such a disease on the family.

## GUALBERTO RUANO, M.D., PHD

Dr. Ruano is a pioneer in the technology and business of personalized medicine. He received his M.D. and PhD at Yale University. He founded Genaisance Pharmaceuticals in 1997 as the pioneer company in Pharmacogenomics. His invention of the Coupled Amplification and Sequencing system is marketed worldwide by Bayer Diagnostics.

## MARTYN W.C. HOWGILL

Mr. Howgill is the Executive Director of InHealth, the Institute for Health Technology Studies, a non-profit research and education organization whose mission is to deliver objective information and credible insights into the role, impact and value of medical technology.

## QUENTIN YOUNG, M.D.

Dr. Young is a practicing internist, Clinical Professor of Preventative Medicine and Community Health at the University of Illinois Medical Center and Senior Attending Physician at Michael Reese Hospital. He is chairman of the Health and Medicine Policy Group and has been a leader in public health policy and medical and social justice issues. He is past President of the Organization, "Physicians for a National Health Program" (PNHP) and currently is on the Board of Directors for that organization.

## JEFFREY R. BOTKIN, M.D., M.P.H.

Dr. Botkin received his M.D. from the University of Pittsburg, did his residency in Pediatrics at the University of Colorado and earned a M.P.H at Johns Hopkins. He currently serves as Professor of Human Genetics (adjunct) at the University of Utah where he is the Associate Vice President for Research Integrity and chairs the Division of Medical Ethics for the Department of Pediatrics.

## LORI ANDREWS, JD

Professor Andrews is a distinguished professor of law at Chicago-Kent College of Law and Director of the Illinois Institute of Technology for Science, Law and Technology. She received her J.D. from Yale, and has been listed by the National Law Journal as one of the 100 Most Influential Lawyers in America. She is the author of 10 books and more than 100 articles on genetics, alternate modes of reproduction and biotechnology.

## DAVID T. RUBIN, M.D.

Dr. Rubin received his medical training in Chicago, where he currently serves as Director of clinical education for gastroenterology and is co-director of the program for Medical Education at the University of Chicago. An avid researcher, he has been working to understand the clinical application of genetics to Inflammatory Bowel Disease and gastrointestinal cancer. He is currently the principle investigator for several clinical trials and research projects.
