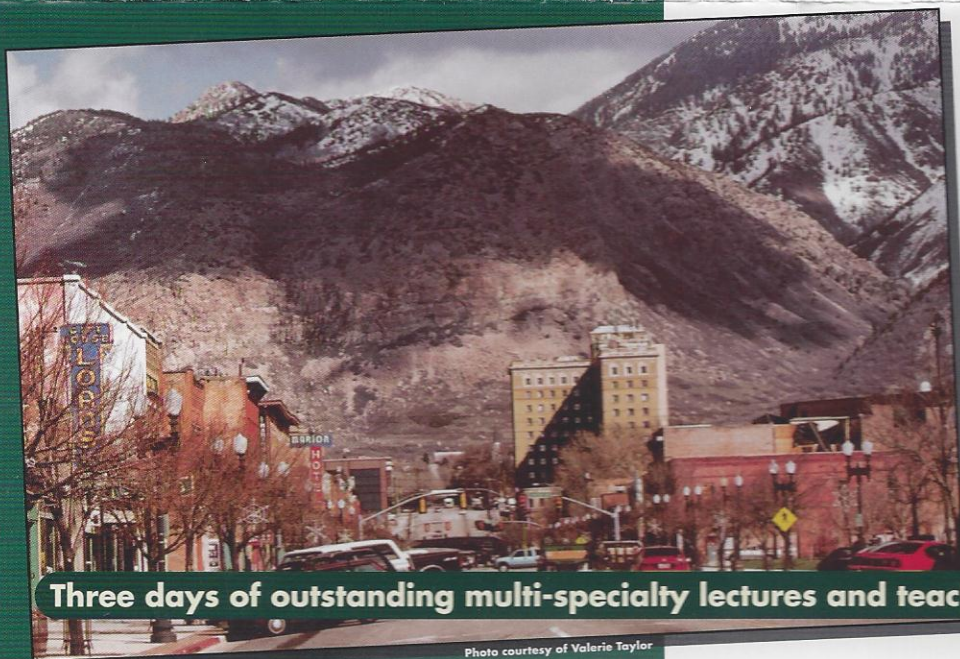

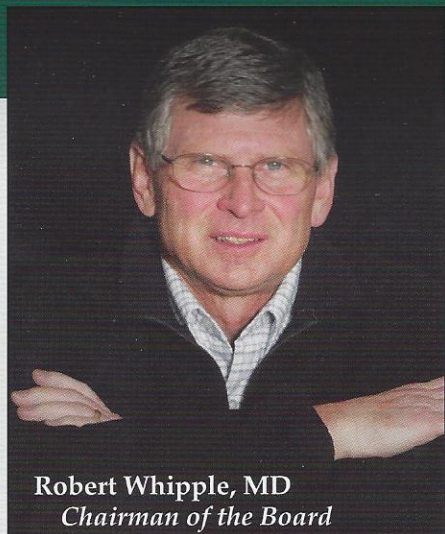

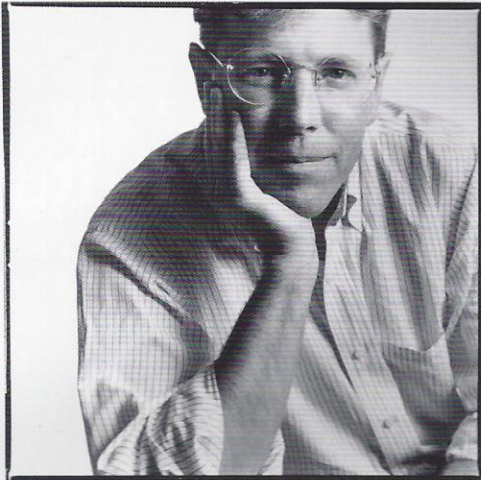

Richard Preston, Ph.D., 50, is regarded as one of the leading authors writing about science in our time. He's written five books, including *The Hot Zone*, *The Cobra Event*, and *The Demon in the Freezer*, which are his "Dark Biology" trio. He is a regular contributor to *The New Yorker*. He holds a Ph.D. in English from Princeton University, and he's won numerous awards for his writing, including the American Institute of Physics Award and the National Magazine Award. He's also the only non-physician ever to receive the Centers for Disease Control's Champion of Prevention Award for public health. An asteroid is named "Preston" in his honor.
