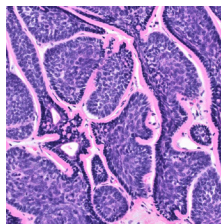
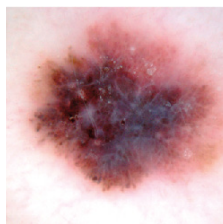

4. Completing an opioid education CME course to fulfill the Utah DOPL prescription licensure.
5. Completing a medical cannabis course Medical Cannabis: Law Update and Best Practices for Safe Use of Medical Cannabis.
6. Experiencing hands-on performance lab skills concerning skin Biopsy, ER ultrasound devices, BLS recertification, and PALS recertification.
7. Identifying resident quality improvement project lectures and posters.
8. Addressing the current medical issues, and through review or integration of new or improved discoveries of current medical issues, improve competence and performance in clinical practice for patient care.
9. Identifying recent changes in healthcare laws and policies from the update of the recent Utah legislature from the UMA perspective as well as economic & policy Issues affecting patients with kidney disease. With this information, it is important to discuss the impact on the medical practice and practitioner.
10. Enhancing competence and performance skills of the interdisciplinary team to improve care of patients needing primary and/or specialty care. The intent is to facilitate productive, collegial action between the medical team, including physicians, physician assistants, nurses, nurse practitioners, social workers, and first responders.

National Kidney Foundation™

1 in 3 American adults is at high risk for kidney disease (KD) • The risk of KD increases to **1 in 2** for those with **Diabetes and high blood pressure** are the two leading causes of KD • Nearly **38.4 million** Americans have kidney failure caused by diabetes • **1/2 of** American adults have high blood pressure, and 20% do so with diabetes combined • Because KD often has **no symptoms**, it can go undetected until it is very advanced • **104,590** Americans on the waiting list for a lifesaving organ transplant, more than **90,263** are currently **dying** waiting for a kidney • Once the kidneys fail, dialysis or a kidney transplant is required • **Over 100,000** Americans die each year from kidney disease • The average annual number of physician visits for an individual with diagnosed kidney disease is **10** to treat people with KD
